### NTRODUCTION

If you're one of the 19 million people who enjoyed an ocean or river cruise last year, you'll already know that cruising has changed beyond recognition during the past decade. Pioneering new ships bursting with innovative facilities, exotic new ports of call and unprecedented levels of luxury and service have transformed this once-staid and fusty industry into a dynamic and exciting launch pad for discovery.

Gone are the days of formal dining with rigid seating plans, cramped cabins with tiny portholes, and long days at sea with nothing to do but dodge loquacious octogenarians. While the lavish glamour and romance of the 'Golden Age' of cruising is still very much alive, most cruise lines now recognise the preference among contemporary travellers for barefoot luxury and adventure, with an emphasis on understated elegance and unique experiences both aboard and ashore.

Passengers have come to expect spacious

cabins with private verandas and indulgent amenities, world-class spas offering revolutionary beauty treatments, champagne and caviar on secluded Caribbean beaches, gourmet dinners served under the stars in the Namib desert or the bay of Dubrovnik, and exclusive visits to the Sistine chapel, remote Amazonian tribal communities or Tahitian pearl farms.

If you haven't yet dipped your toes in the bottomless waters of cruising, not only will you be unaware of what you're missing but, chances are, you'll be somewhat confused about what's actually involved. With unprecedented choice and diversity in ships, destinations and activities, the cruise industry is revolutionising the way in which the world travels, yet familiarising yourself with what's on offer can be a daunting task.

Should you go for a romantic week à deux in Costa Rica aboard an elegant sailing yacht? Or treat your brood to an action-packed fortnight in the Med onboard a family-friendly ship (the kids will love the children's clubs and Dad can perfect his golf swing while you unwind in the spa)? Or do you start ticking off the things on your bucket list - visit the penguins in Antarctica, hunt out the Northern Lights in Lapland and learn to scuba dive in the Bahamas?

Measuring 1,187ft long and carrying 5,412 passengers, Royal Caribbean International's twin ships *Oasis of the Seas* and *Allure of the Seas* are the world's largest cruise ships. In comparison with these behemoths, the ships below are relatively small. However, mega ships can be overwhelming and those below offer all the benefits of large ship cruising while remaining manageable.

## MICCILIFE

This quintessentially Italian cruise line is proud of its distinctive Mediterranean heritage, reflected in a warm, vibrant ambiance across its fleet (11 ships and counting), chic interiors and reassuringly Italian cuisine. A family-run company, MSC boasts impeccable credentials where bambinos are looked after by qualified staff who care for children aged three to 17, all day, every day, free of charge.

The pioneering MSC Yacht Club, currently offered on three ships, enables passengers to enjoy the intimacy and luxury of small ship cruising while having access to the extensive facilities of a large ship. Located on the prestigious foredecks of Splendida, Fantasia and Divina, the Yacht Clubs comprise some 70 plush suites, an exclusive pool deck, bar and restaurant, and come with dedicated butler and concierge service and direct access to the MSC Aurea Spa, one of the best spas afloat (msccruises.co.uk; 0844 561 7412).

## OCEANA CRUVES

Oceania offers a luxury product at competitive prices, with a focus on sensational cuisine and service onboard its five ships (included in our large ship category, although classed mid-size in the context of the cruise industry). This 'affordable luxury' is largely achieved by providing five-star facilities and service comparable with ultra-luxury competitors but not including alcohol or gratuities in the cruise fares.

Oceania's 1,240-passenger ship *Marina* and *Riviera* blend large ship facilities with a refined mid-size ship feel, while its 684-passenger vessels offer an intimate, country club ambiance. While Oceania wins critical acclaim for its excellent cuisine, praise is equally deserved for its unusual itineraries – the fleet sails to 330 ports across the globe, many of which are neglected by other lines, and ships often spend multiple nights in port to enable more extensive, relaxed exploration of destinations (oceaniacruises.com; 0845 505 1920).



## AZAMARA GUI

Azamara could justly promote its plush twin ships, *Quest* and *Journey*, as its core strength, yet the cruise line prefers to emphasise the unique nature of its shore excursions. With the goal of 'on-shore immersion', whereby passengers actually become part of local life, rather than mere observers, Azamara delivers more overnight stays in lesser-visited places (like Ho Chi Minh City, St Barts and Myanmar) and provides some of the industry's most imaginative excursions.

These shore-based adventures include day trips, such as a Ferrari driving tour in Civitavecchia or Croatian liqueur tastings in Zadora, and night tours, such as an Imperial Russian Court evening in St Petersburg or a private visit to the Sistine Chapel. Innovative multi-night trips, such as an overnight visit to Hiroshima from Osaka on the bullet train or a trip to Laos from Bangkok, can be arranged (azamaraclubcruises. co.uk; 0844 493 4016).



## SIMPLIFA CRUITES

The all-suite, all-inclusive, all-frills Silversea provides old-school cruise glamour in far-flung corners of the world. The line's five larger ships carry between 296 and 540 passengers and adhere to some of the industry's most exacting standards of quality and service, while offering a wide choice of onboard facilities – the prized benefit of mid-sized ships.

Seabourn arguably set the benchmark for ultra-luxury cruising in 2009, when it launched the Seabourn Odyssey. Subsequently joined by two identical mid-size (450-passenger) vessels, the ground-breaking trio offer the greatest space-to-passenger ratio of any cruise ship and the largest spas in the luxury sector, and a platform which extends from the rear of the vessel for waterskiing, sailing and snorkelling. All cabins on these ships are opulent suites (the smallest measuring a whopping 295 square feet) and 90 percent boast private verandas.

What Seabourn's three smaller (208-passenger) ships lack in facilities compared to their sisters is compensated for by a staff-to-passenger ratio of nearly 1:1, ensuring some of the most attentive service in the industry. The twin three-masted *Wind Spirit* and *Wind Star* each accommodate 148 passengers, while the five-masted *Wind Surf* carries 312 guests.

Despite *Wind Surf's* claim to be the world's largest sailing yacht, all three ships offer one of the key benefits of small ship cruising – access to atmospheric, bijou ports which escape the attentions (and crowds) of large ship destinations.

'Casual elegance' is Windstar's dress code and general mantra, with the clean lines of its ships reflected in understated, sophisticated interiors and complemented by intuitive service.

Large teak decks, dotted with pools, hot tubs and sun loungers, provide peaceful spots from which to admire the yacht's billowing sails and the coastline slipping past, while candlelit dinners on deck complete the decadent experience (windstarcruises.co.uk; 020 7292 2369).

Step out of the pool on one of SeaDream's 112-passenger twin mega-yachts and you'll discover a fresh towel and your favourite cocktail by your lounger (and SeaDream adheres to an all-inclusive philosophy, so you won't be charged for the pleasure).

This French cruise line brings a distinctive 'je ne sais quoi' to cruising, with chic ships and a cosmopolitan following (and matchless pastries). Of the company's three ships - Ponant, L'Austral and Le Boréal - the first is a three-masted yacht and the last two are slick new expedition ships. The recently refurbished Ponant accommodates just 64 passengers, who revel in her silence and grace as she navigates the oceans under sail.

From their sleek contours to their sophisticated nautical interiors, L'Austral and Le Boréal resemble private yachts more than hardy 264-passenger expedition vessels. Nonetheless, each ship is equally well-suited to negotiating icebergs in Antarctica as picking its way through tropical islands in the Caribbean and, with a Carita Spa, beautifully-appointed cabins (95 percent with balconies) and quintessentially French cuisine, cruising à la française is a winning formula

Four attentive crew, including an excellent chef, are on hand to provide iced towels when you return from your shore outings (a private guide and driver are provided), serve mouth-watering Thai cuisine under starry skies and teach you how to fold lotus flowers to give as offerings at temples.
